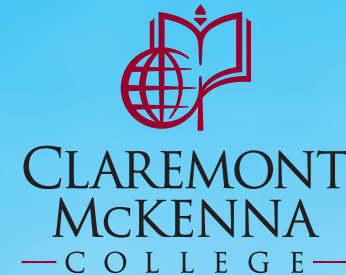
International Place of The Claremont Colleges (I-Place)

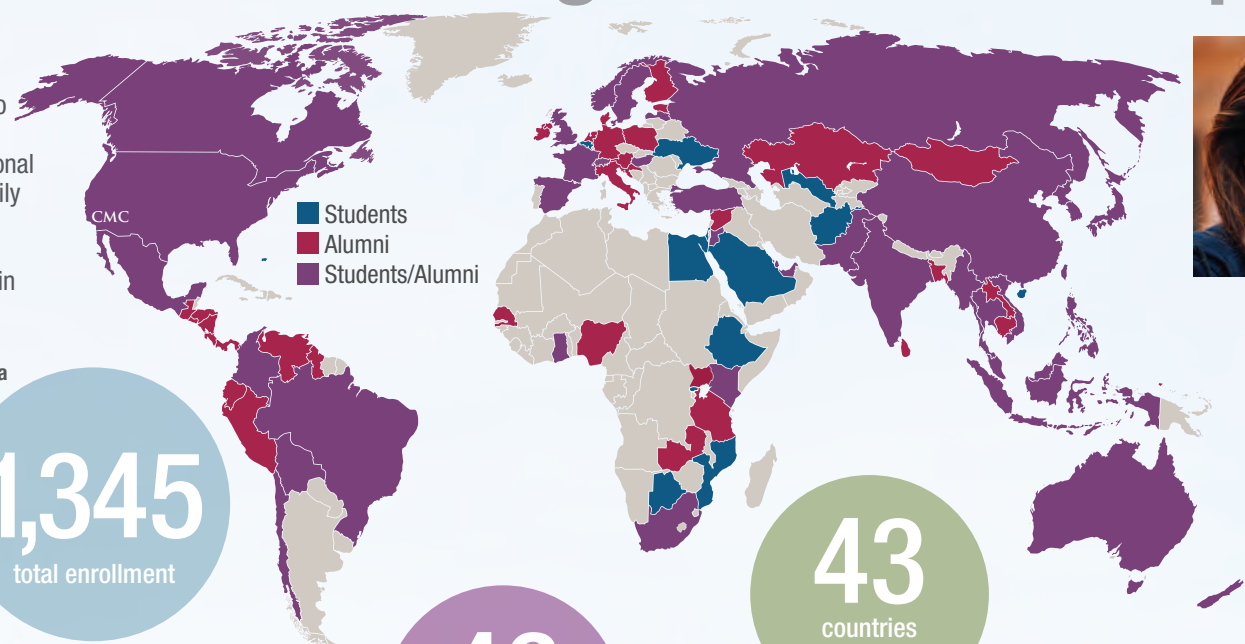
